

Common Name	Latin Name	Plant Description	Growing Conditions/ Habitat
Ninebark (Shrub)	<i>Physocarpus opulifolius</i>	Small or medium-sized shrub which grows up to 2-3 metres tall. Peeling bark and 7 to 10 cm long dark green or reddish leaves . Flowers in late spring with clusters of white or pink blooms. Red fruit provides fall interest as well as food for birds.	Will grow in a location that receives full sun to part shade, but flowers best in full sun. Drought tolerant. Grows in both dry and wet locations. Tolerates either alkaline or acidic soil. Quite hardy
Nannyberry (Shrub)	<i>Viburnum lentago</i>	Large shrub grows 4-7 metres tall. Flowers in late spring and has creamy white flowers. Berries are red to orange	Requires full or partial sun. Grows in wet rich sites near water, along forest edges, by roadsides, swamps and thickets.
Pussy Willow (Shrub)	<i>Salix discolor</i>	Trees or tall shrubs 2-6 metres, crowns rounded. Sometimes used as a hardy, fast-growing ornamental shrub. Important food source for bees and other insects in early spring	Requires full sun. Prefers moist soils but more tolerant than other willows of drier areas. Grows in ditches, wet meadows, wooded swamps, lakeshores and streambanks.
Red Osier Dogwood (Shrub)	<i>Cornus stolonifera</i>	Grows to 2-3 metres, forms thickets, Dark red branches, White flowers. Birds will love the fruit. Well- developed root system, low branches can also produce new roots. Excellent plant for soil retention and stopping erosion.	Prefers full or partial sun. Very adaptable plant, grows in clay or wet soils, hilly terrain and poorly drained areas, as well as dry regions. Tolerant of flooding.

<p>Sweet Gale (Shrub)</p>	<p><i>Myrica gale</i></p>	<p>1.5 metres tall. Forms dense, low thickets on rocky shorelines. Provides cover for many species. Sweet gale is a nitrogen fixer. Fragrant leaves and stem</p>	<p>Prefers full sun. Thrives along shores of fens, streams and lakes. Survives prolonged flooding</p>
<p>White Spruce (Tree)</p>	<p><i>Picea glauca</i></p>	<p>15 to 30 metres tall Very hardy and easy to grow Very attractive trees, keeping their needles all year long and naturally forming a pyramidal shape all the way down to the ground. They are an important shelter and food source for wildlife.</p>	<p>Prefers full sun and does best with at least 6 hours of direct sunlight per day, but they are also very tolerant of shade. Prefer soil that is slightly acidic and moist but well draining. These trees grow best in loam but will do well in sand and even well-drained clay.</p>
<p>Larch/Tamarack (Tree)</p>	<p><i>Larix laricina</i></p>	<p>Up to 25 metres tall. Coniferous, needles turn yellow and are shed in autumn.</p>	<p>Grows in wet areas, full sun, and tolerates all soil types</p>
<p>White Birch (Tree)</p>	<p><i>Betula papyrifera</i></p>	<p>15-25 metres tall. Mature bark white and peeling in large sheets. May grow with single or multiple trunks, fast growing</p>	<p>Requires full sun, moist to dry conditions</p>

<p>Red Oak Tree)</p>	<p><i>Quercus rubra</i></p>	<p>Moderately fast-growing oak tree reaches mature heights of 18 to 23 metres, with a spread of 14 to 16 metres. The tree is valued for its deep root system, Provides summer shade and reliable fall color</p>	<p>Handsome, adaptable tree that thrives in nearly any setting.</p> <p>Prefers six hours of direct sunlight every day. New trees require regular moisture, especially during hot, dry weather. Established trees are relatively drought tolerant.</p>
<p>New England Aster (Wildflower)</p>	<p><i>Symphotrichum novae-angliae</i></p>	<p>Grows up to 120 cm tall with a stout, hairy stem. Flower heads are showy with yellow disc florets at the center and ray florets that range from a deep purple or rose to rarely white. Blooms from late summer to October. Popular with pollinators</p>	<p>Thrives in full sun or light shade Prefers moist to dry soil (no standing water). Will grow in a wide variety of habitats and soil types.</p>
<p>Blue Flag Iris (Wildflower)</p>	<p><i>Iris versicolor</i></p>	<p>Grows 10–80 cm high Blue/purple flower Blooms during May to July</p>	<p>Grows in wet conditions, full sun</p>
<p>Joe Pye- Weed (Wildflower)</p>	<p><i>Eupatorium maculatum</i></p>	<p>Grows to 1-3 metres in height Pink/purple flowers. Blooms in July and August, Attracts many species of butterflies</p>	<p>Wet to moist conditions, full sun.</p>
