WHAT IS THE CURRENT STATE OF OTTY LAKE?

After many months of gathering and analysing all available information about our lake environment, the State of the Lake Report is now being prepared. Copies of the Executive Summary of the Report will be available at the AGM on July 8 and Sheanna Tinlin, Program Manager for the Tay Watershed Lake Management Planning Program will make a presentation at the AGM on the work to date. A draft version of the complete State of the Lake Report will be available for all lake residents and our community partners by the end of July. To reduce costs most copies of the Report will be available in CD format although we will ensure that some paper copies are distributed around the lake to be shared with those who do not have computer access.

NEXT STEP

We need your input!

During the later part of the summer and into the fall following the distribution of the (draft) State of the Lake Report, members of the Otty Lake Management Committee want to meet with small groups of lake residents as well as with our community partners (municipalities, MOE, MNR, Conservation Authority, Stewardship Council etc.) to get your feedback e.g. we would like to speak with road association groups and other gatherings of Otty Lake residents.

In the first round of discussions you told the Lake Management Committee that good water quality, natural shorelines, beautiful scenery, good fishing and swimming, and lots of birds and wildlife were important qualities of Otty Lake. The State of the Lake Report will describe what the current state of these and other characteristics actually is.

NOW it is up to each of us – those who live and work and play at Otty Lake - to plan together with our community partners to ensure that Otty Lake is the lake we want it to be 5/10/20 years down the road.

Your feedback, based on the information in the State of the Lake Report, will be used to prepare the Otty Lake Management Plan. This Plan will provide guidance to both lake residents and the municipalities and other community partners on how we should care for Otty Lake into the future.

Please participate. The future of Otty Lake is in your hands!

Thank you to all Otty Lake seasonal and permanent residents who have assisted in the collection of information about the lake through – identification of shoreline photos, providing information about water levels, ice out dates, settlement history, water quality data, information about the fish, wildlife and plants of our lake area and much much more. The State of the Lake Report is a compilation of your information and could not have been completed without your assistance.

DRUMMOND/NORTH ELMSLEY TOWNSHIP UPDATE

As has been mentioned in previous "Captain Otty's Log" Council issues, the Drummond/North Elmsley has pledged its support to the cooperative approach proposed for the Lake Management Planning process by the OLA. Council has also advised that the Township is pleased to endorse the Waste Water and Well Workshop workshops to educate property owners regarding the proper maintenance of septic systems and the presentation of alternatives for small lots and systems that require replacement. The Reeve and Council are pleased to announce that, in 2006, Township spending shall remain at the levels set in 2005 and as a result, the municipal tax rate has been reduced by 13.06%. The only new property tax revenues in the budget are those funds that are directly attributable to new development within the Township.

The overall tax rate has been set at 0.1046510. This rate combines the County, Education and Township tax rates and represents an overall rate reduction of 10.95% to 2005 levels. The assessment on individual properties has increased at an average of 15.79% however, as all too many waterfront owners are aware, your property assessment has likely increased above the average levels. This factor is all the more reason for the reduction in the tax rate.

What's new in 2006?

- The Township now has a Reuse Centre operating at the landfill site at 745 Code Road, for reusable items such as furniture, appliances, toys, building materials, tools, dishes and other items that may be deemed reusable by the landfill attendant. These items are available to Ratepayers at no charge. The reuse of items will help reduce the waste that goes into our landfill.
- Please take note of the attractive new Township signs. The signs will be located at all major entrance points into the Township and more signs will be erected in our Hamlets and on municipal buildings in the near future.
- The next Township Official Plan (OP) revision is due to be completed in 2008 therefore Council will begin the process of seeking public input to the OP later in this calendar year.
- A new Road Superintendent has been hired by the name of Carl Scissons. Mr. Scissons is a long time resident of North Elmsley ward and comes to us after serving in a similar capacity in Rideau Lakes Township.

WHAT IS SOURCE WATER PROTECTION?

Sommer Casgrain-Robertson Mississippi-Rideau Source Protection Region

There is a new piece of legislation on the horizon and it aims to protect lakes, rivers and underground aquifers that feed our municipal drinking water systems. The goal of this legislation is to protect these "sources" of municipal drinking water from potential contamination and depletion. The legislation, known as the *Clean Water Act*, 2005, is currently moving through the approvals process in the Provincial legislature.

The proposed *Clean Water Act* (Bill 43) was introduced into the Ontario legislature in December 2005 and passed Second Reading in May. The Ministry of Environment is now organizing Standing Committee hearings to gather more public input, make adjustments to the Act, and proceed to Third Reading and Royal Assent.

Conservation Authorities have been chosen to coordinate this work across Ontario and locally the Mississippi Valley and Rideau Valley Conservation Authorities have been paired together to jointly deliver source water protection. Conservation Authorities were asked to deliver source water protection at the local level because of their watershed jurisdiction and their expertise in watershed management. This experience and watershed focus makes them the ideal group to bring science-based credibility to the process.

A governing group made up of local stakeholders will ensure that community wishes are brought to bear and that community consultation is undertaken at each stage of the process. This group, known as the Source Protection Committee, cannot be created until the Act is passed which is expected at the end of 2006. How this Committee will be chosen is yet to be determined by the Ministry of Environment.

Source water protection starts with the production of a Water Budget and a Watershed Characterization Report. These documents will give us a map of our water supply including how water flows through our watersheds, where and how it is used and how it gets replenished. This work will lead to the identification of current drinking water threats and an assessment of the risk associated with each threat. Once that is done, the Source Protection Committee will development a Source Protection Plan which will be a roadmap to minimizing or eliminating the highest risks to our municipal drinking water.

Cottage wells or private surface water intakes are not discussed at all in the proposed Act. The Source Protection Committee may choose to

establish activities like incentive programs and landowner education to help protect the sources of water feeding private wells and surface intakes. This will be a decision by the Committee.

Most people consider the Clean Water Act an important and smart piece of legislation that will help protect municipal drinking water supplies from contamination and depletion. The result will be that places such as Carleton Place, Smiths Falls, Perth and Ottawa (which draw municipal drinking water from local rivers) and Almonte, Carp, Kemptville, Merrickville and Westport (which draw water from groundwater) will have science-based, community-driven tools to protect their drinking water supplies sustainably into the future.

DIRECTIONS FROM PERTH by car:


