PROPERTY STANDARDS BY-LAWS ADOPTED

In June and July of this year, the Townships of North Burgess and North Elmsley adopted Property Standards By-laws dealing specifically with the problem of sewage disposal. These By-laws were prepared with the co-operation of your executive and the Ministry of Housing, and they represent a big step toward a more satisfactory state of affairs for Otty Lake. You may have read about it in the July 7 and 14th issues of the Perth Courier.

What it means for us is that:

- It is now illegal to permit a sewage system to leak or discharge onto the ground or into the water.
- Before July, 1979 all sewage systems (other than holding tanks) must be at least 50' back from the water and at least 3' above the highest water table or flood level.
- Fines are up to \$1,000 per day of non-compliance.

As further provisions are now being considered by one of the Townships, we will wait until the next newsletter to publish a fuller description of these laws. In the meantime, ask yourself if your own system is good enough. Really good enough?

WATER QUALITY

The Biological condition (i.e. algae, weeds,) appears (we repeat, appears) to be relatively stable at present. The water has been clearer this year than for several years past; however, there is no reason to believe that the nutrients are not now in storage in the sludge on the bottom and able to set off a fresh round of algae and weed growth in future.

The Bacteriological condition of the lake has been disappointing this year. From a fairly good result in 1975 (a dry year) the lake has experienced slightly higher counts in 1976, then higher again in 1977. The reasons for this are not clear as yet, but obviously there is still effluent of sewage systems getting into the lake. The geometric mean of the bacteria counts for each of these recent years was as follows:

REGATTA 1977

WATER LEVELS

Attempts were made to maintain stop-logs in the dam from July 1st to September 1st as per the policy and, despite several unauthorized removals of the stop-log, the water this year stayed within 3½ inches of the normal July 1 or datum level.

The executive attempted to alter the dam to minimize spring flooding (as agreed in 1976) but has so far been unsuccessful.

Beaver control continues to be a problem. Traps were set last winter under authority of Ministry of Natural Resources but with little apparent effect. The fight goes on. The Wilsons of Area 4 lost 8 trees last season. Can anyone top that?
